GOOD NEIGHBOR DO's and DON'TS REMINDERS

We are justifiably proud of the harmonious nature of our community, as well as the beauty of it. Our homeowners enjoy all the wonderful community amenities, events and services it has to offer, which is why they choose to live and call Arrowhead Estates home. To keep our community looking its very best at all times, we encourage everyone to be mindful of the following community reminders that are frequently reported and identified throughout Arrowhead. Here are a few Dos and Don'ts to help keep it that way. These are not new rules, but rather a friendly reminder of existing rules from our Homeowner Documents as well as some commonsense items. We respectfully ask all of our homeowners to help keep our community looking its finest.

DO mow your lawn on a regular basis, keep your lawn and beds weed-free, bushes trimmed, and remove dead palm fronds.

DON'T swim in the retention ponds or allow your children or pets to swim in the ponds.

 ${\bf DO}$ observe the speed limit (25 MPH or less) for ${\bf ALL}$ vehicles on all neighborhood streets.

DO park your cars in your garage or driveway as much as possible; and do NOT park on the sidewalks or lawns. Remind guests to not park directly across from another parked car.

DO submit a Request for Architectural Modification before making any exterior changes to your home. Form can be found on our website: www.arrowheadestates.info

DO pick up after your dog when walking through the neighborhood. It's YOUR Doodie! **DO** keep you dog on a leash!! This will reduce the chances of the pet wandering away and possibly hurting itself and others. **DON'T** let your dog bark for hours.

DO lock your car doors. Do **NOT** leave valuables in your vehicle. If you see suspicious activity, call 911. For Nonemergency, call 352-343-2101.

NO ..fowl ...or livestock shall be kept or maintained in the Community unless approved in advance by the Board.

DO call Duke if a street-light is out near your home.

DO stay connected. Check out our private Facebook group, our neighborhood website, and Sentry's community page.

DO participate in your neighborhood. Contact the Board of Directors or Sentry Management to volunteer for the Board, a committee or other community activity.

DO contact Sentry Management with any suggestions/comments and solutions regarding the neighborhood or Association.

DO remember that the pool and pool parking lot are closed from dusk to dawn.
